In Beaver County fire permits are required year round, (January 1st to December 31st).

Fire Ban

When conditions are extremely hot and dry, a fire ban may be issued. When this occurs your fire permit will be suspended or cancelled and your fire must be extinguished.

Information is updated immediately if there are any changes to current fire conditions.

What you can Not burn

- ⇒ Preserved Wood
- ⇒ Material from automobile bodies and tires
- ⇒ Rubber or plastic and any material that contains rubber or plastic
- ⇒ Used oil
- ⇒ Animal manure
- ⇒ Pathological waste



In accordance with the Environment Protection and Enhancement Act, RSA 2000, c E-12 C Part 5

Safe burning practices

⇒ A fire permit is a legal document that authorizes a person to burn at a time specified on the permit. By obtaining a fire permit, you have indicated your intention to burn and are responsible for conducting the burn in a safe manner.

⇒ Check all burning carried out in the winter. Hold-Over fires happen when embers from a previously lit fire are exposed by a strong wind or other factors

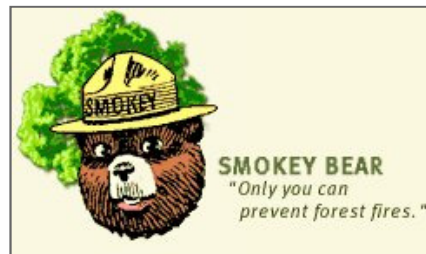
⇒ FIRE SAFE BURN TIPS

Walk the burn area

- Roll the debris over to check for hot spots
- Spread and/or stir the debris
- Water down and extinguish hot spots
- Probe the burned area to ensure there are no hot spots.

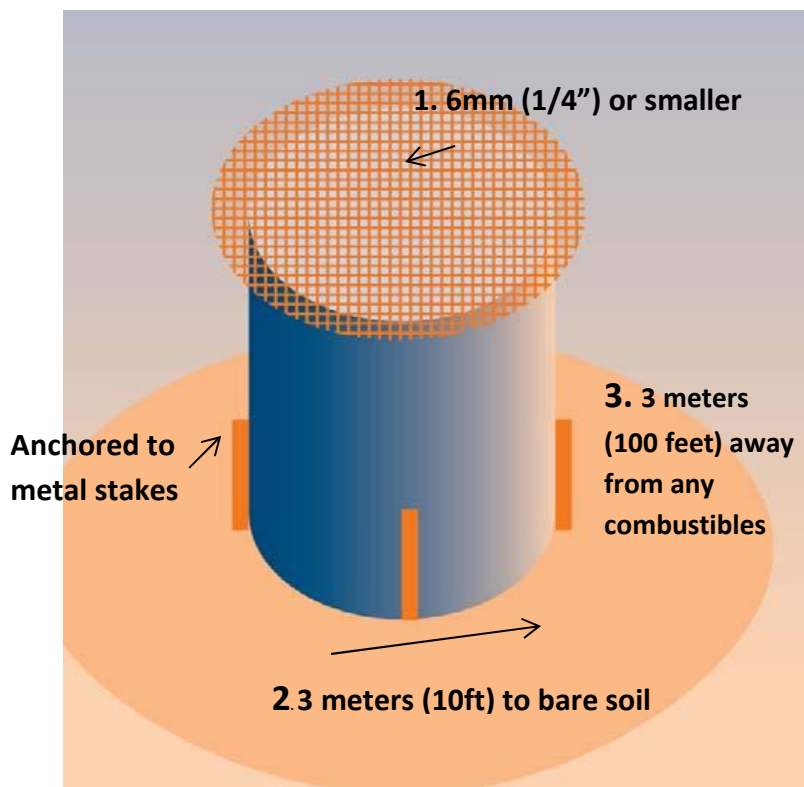
Please practice safe burning procedures



Adhere strictly to the conditions stated on your fire permit. Under the Forest and Prairie Protection Act and/or contravenes Section 22 of the Beaver Emergency Services Commission Bylaw No. 4-2013, you may be held responsible for fire suppression cost or any penalties that occur of burning without a permit, or failing to comply with the conditions stated on your fire permit

PREPARATION

1. ALWAYS COVER YOUR BURN BARREL/WITH 6MM (1/4") OR SMALLER METAL MESH SCREEN.
2. CLEAR AWAY ANY DEBRIS FOR AT LEAST 3 METERS (10 FEET) AROUND YOUR BURN BARREL AND WORK UP TO EXPOSED SOIL.
3. POSITION YOUR BARREL AT LEAST 30 METERS (100 FEET) AWAY FROM ANY COMBUSTIBLE MATERIAL
4. ANNUALLY INSPECT YOUR BARREL TO ENSURE IT IS IN GOOD WORKING ORDER.
